Map Filtering: Users can now filter projects by a variety of features including Location, Type, Value, and Last Update.

Add Project Location to Map: Users can now add location pins to the map to add new

projects near them.

Project Notes & Updates:

Allows users to add notes and images to a project. These notes are public and available for all MEP users to see.

Add Photos: MEP can now access a user's photo library for photos to be added to projects. Users can also take a photo and immediately attach it to a project.

Notifications: Users can now receive notifications to alert them of updates to projects currently being tracked, and projects nearby.


BLUE PLAINS TUNNEL:

ENR PROJECT OF THE YEAR

What is success? Success is sometimes difficult to determine in the labor movement as things aren't as black and white as we would like them to be. There isn't always a win or lose, pass or fail, benchmark to go off of. Much of the time, we are out on the front lines fighting for good paying jobs and opportunities for the working men and women of LIUNA. However, we also find ourselves supporting non-union workers and local residents to protect their rights. We do so in hopes of showing them, and others, what a strong union and a collective bargaining agreement can do for the betterment of their lives and careers.

Of course, we want every company we meet, to recognize what a union can do for them and their workforce, but unfortunately, this isn't the case in every situation. LECET believes in the top-down approach. We believe in labor and management working hand in hand in order to be successful in today's market where a skilled, trained workforce is needed more than ever. Sometimes LECET strategically partners with all departments of LIUNA in order to work more effectively. That is exactly what happened on the Blue Plains Tunnel in Washington, D.C., which was recently awarded ENR's 2016 Project of the Year. LECET and the Organizing and Political Departments





of the Mid-Atlantic Region strategically collaborated to get the outcome the local residents and our members in the District of Columbia deserved.

The Blue Plains Tunnel outreach started well before the project kicked off. In fact, it started on an entirely different project. Back in 2009/2010, a joint venture between the contractors Skanska and Tidewater was working non-union at the 11th Street Bridge in Washington, D.C. Tidewater managed the operations and Skanska was the construction partner in charge of hiring. LECET made several outreach attempts to sit down and discuss a project labor agreement (PLA), but the construction team was dismissive. We knew that time was of the essence, as that same team was recently awarded the first of many upcoming D.C. tunnel projects, which made this target our number one priority. After several top-down attempts, the Skanska Tidewater team finally gave us an emphatic NO in regards to working with the trades.

Although we didn't give up on our top-down efforts, the organizing department was called into action. They pulled certified payrolls and quickly realized that the construction team wasn't living up to the mandated first source requirement, which requires contractors to hire locally. They also found out that diversity among the workforce was unsettling. Now, armed with information about the team and their hiring practices on the 11th Street Bridge, it was decided that job actions, which included rallies and demonstrations, were needed. The demonstrations worked as intended. They received much-needed media coverage,

and the D.C. City Council took notice. A roundtable was held, where rank and file members gave damaging testimony about the hiring practices of the Skanska Tidewater team. Through these efforts, the information on the 11th Street Bridge eventually filtered down to the DC Water Board, which oversees the tunnel projects in the District of Columbia. We packed the DC Water Board meetings with members and local residents. The POWER of LIUNA was clearly felt as the Board called out the construction team, letting them know that the issues on the 11st Street Bridge were not going be tolerated on the Blue Plains Tunnel project. Not long after that, the DC Water Board awarded the Blue Plains Tunnel project to a joint venture of Traylor, Skanska and Jay Dee, with Traylor overseeing the hiring. Traylor reached out to LIUNA and the Mid-Atlantic LECET team and met them in California to execute the agreement on the Blue Plains Tunnel. The rest is history.

Since then, all Washington, D.C. tunnel projects have gone union and the \$600 million Northeast Boundary Tunnel, which is being awarded mid-2017, has all union bidders. These tunnel projects will employ thousands of LIUNA members, providing well-paying, long-term jobs and benefits. The Mid-Atlantic Region, led by our Regional Vice-President, Denny Martire, is proud that ENR recognized the Blue Plains Tunnel which finished on-time, under budget and without an accident, as the 2016 Project of the Year. It was a complete top-down, bottom-up, and political effort, which we can say without a doubt, was and continues to be a SUCCESS!

LECET I.T. CONFERENCE WRAP-UP




